

LMS Boys Restroom

Hazards, Practices, Procedures, Protective Equipment (PPE) & Controls

Space Description: Restrooms are located throughout the building.

Uses:

Toilet facilities

Handwashing

CONTROL REQUIREMENTS

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| <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Reduce Crowding – Self monitor | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Students wash or disinfect hands before leaving room |
| <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Face coverings required AT ALL TIMES | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Paper towels used for turning off tap once hands are clean |
| <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Maximum Occupancy – Number of urinals and stalls | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Paper towels used for opening door to exit (if present) once hands are clean |
| <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Spacing while waiting in line at 6 feet along wall | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Trash can is placed at exit to encourage towel use to exit |

ENTRY PROCEDURES

- Make sure restroom is not at full capacity before entering. Wait outside until someone exits.
- Students will be masked and enter the restroom keeping 6 ft from each other and go directly to a stall or urinal.

EXIT PROCEDURES

- Once finished using the stall each student will wash hands and exit the restroom.

ACTIVITIES/TASKS

- Greater than designated occupancy in room
- Loitering prohibited
- Hand disinfection
- Exit procedure
- Waste disposal
- Cleaning

PROCEDURES

- Loading limits should be firmly adhered to
- Students shall not remain in the restroom if not actively using it
- Hands should be disinfected before leaving the restroom. Soap and water should be used. 20 seconds of vigorous scrubbing on the front, back, between fingers and up to wrists for 20 seconds (sing "Old McDonald" verse).
- Once hands are clean leave water running, use a paper towel to dry hands then shut off water, the hand should touch nothing, but the drying towel once rinsed.
- Trash cans at exits, janitors use gloves and face coverings when handling trash special waste handling
- Nightly cleaning with standard disinfectants is sufficient

PITFALLS / VIGILANCE / MONITORING

- Equipment needs be in good repair to reduce risks
- Line spacing <6 feet
- Masks worn not covering mouth and nose
- Surfaces (handles, doors) touched once hands are clean
- Loitering
- Not staying along wall to allow passage of others
